SAN BERNARDINO -- APRIL 4, 2022 -- The San Bernardino County Democratic Party resolved on March 24, 2022 to endorse the hotel workers' boycott of the Chateau Marmont in Los Angeles as they fight to change the culture of their workplace and demand justice.

The endorsement states, "We stand together with them against the use of binding arbitration to silence workers, and we support their call to end mistreatment and disrespect in the workplace."

The San Bernardino County Democratic Party resolved unanimously to boycott the Chateau Marmont until it rehires workers dismissed in March 2020 in accordance with their legal rights.
